Invasive species, also referred to as displaced relatives, are plants and animals that are found living in areas other than their native region. Since these species have not existed in the local balance of nature for hundreds of years, they often lack the disease/predators/competitors that limit their populations in their native range. Invasive species have the ability to change native landscapes which often leads to the loss of edible, medicinal, and culturally important species as well as the reduction of wildlife habitat. It is important to protect native species and ecosystems; therefore, monitoring and management of invasive species is vital. Prevention is the most effective way to control the spread of displaced relatives and Early Detection Rapid Response (EDRR) practices should be considered when drafting management plans.
