

Program Requirements

Pathways Participants must:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Be accepted or enrolled in an accredited college, university, or technical school
- Maintain part-time or full-time student status as defined by your educational institution
- Must have and maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher
- Be an enrolled member of a federally recognized tribe and submit a BIA Form 4432 with your application

Some positions require:

- Ability to obtain a security clearance
- Medical Exam, Drug Testing
- Valid Driver's License

FAQs

Q: What types of internships are available? Pathways Internships are customized to fit each student's personal and professional goals. The type of work an intern performs depends on both the student's interests and the hiring needs of Tribes and the BIA. Check out the back of this brochure to see a list of common program areas!

Q: Where do internships take place? Students may intern in-person or virtually

across the United States. If an internship requires in-person fieldwork or training, we pay for all student travel and housing for the duration of the internship.


Q: What are the benefits of a federal job?
