Eligibility:

- 10th 12th grade students (Ages: 14- 17). Graduating seniors may apply if under the age of 18 by June 21st.
- Tribal citizen of the Tribes within the Southwest Region OR Tribal citizen residing within the Southwest Region.
 - O Southwest Region consists of Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, Southern California and Utah. See website for map.

The Southwest Summer Youth Practicum (SWSYP) is open to students interested in pursuing a career in fishery and wildlife management, forestry, range management, watershed science, hydrology, conservation law enforcement or other natural resources related fields.

The SWSYP provides a hands-on learning experiences, classroom and outdoor field sessions that enables students to learn concepts and techniques used to manage natural resources.

Summer temperatures in the area can range from 50 - 80 degrees Fahrenheit and may include wind, rain, etc. Some activities may involve strenuous hiking or outdoor activities.
